Continued Word from our Philos Leader

In 1958, seven women met to launch our Chapter. After holding a tea to recruit prospective members, the women took turns hosting meeting and events in their homes. As 1959 progressed, with 75 members, the very first officers were elected and Kiki Bakakos was our first President!



By 1960 our Philoptochos hosted its first luncheon “Spring Promenade” and 200 members and friends attended. Also, the first fashion show, “Fashion Premier” was held that September and the event was considered successful with 300 attendees and a net profit of \$600. In addition, in November, Mary Koulogeorge chaired the very first Christmas Bazaar at the Wilmette Women’s Club. Philoptochos members donated hand-made items to be sold for profit.

In 1961 our organization received its official national charter as the Saints Peter and Paul Philoptochos Society, Inc. recognized as Chapter 381 of the national Philoptochos.

Our mission of the Saints Peter and Paul Philoptochos has always been to raise money to support its many philanthropic causes, in our immediate community as well as through the world. Thousands of dollars have also been contributed toward major church projects, such as the purchase of two organs, installation of the iconostasis, the kitchen, landscaping and remodeling of the fellowship hall.

Our Philoptochos participates in two successful Metropolis-wide programs, initiated by Georgia Barris: “Feed the Hungry” and the “Quilt-A-Thon.” In recent years, the Saints Peter and Paul Philoptochos’ annual charitable contributions budget has grown to between \$50,000 and \$70,000. We are committed to assisting a wide range of ministries, which include, children, families and the elderly. In addition, the parish philanthropy fund assists families needing help, in strict confidence. This year, 2020, we have donated over \$52,000 dollars to both local and international organizations.

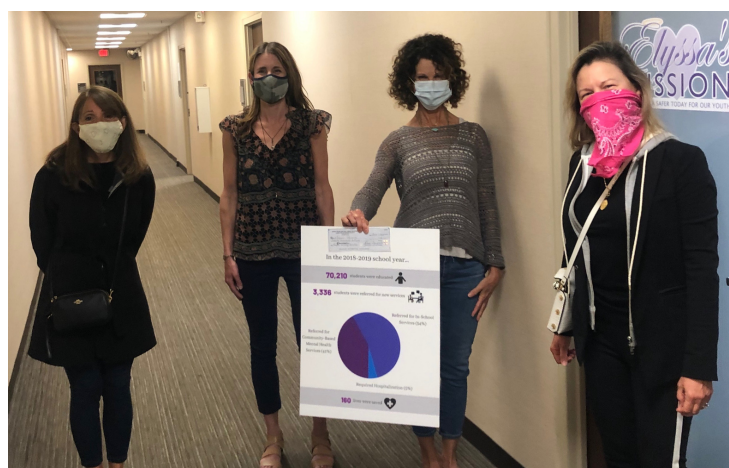

We recently met our goal and delivered the check to this very worthy foundation that provides help, support and suicide prevention programs to prevent teen suicide

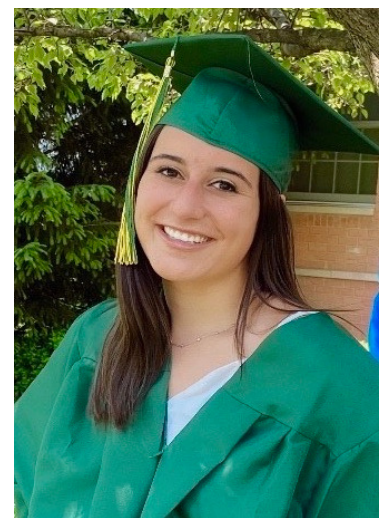

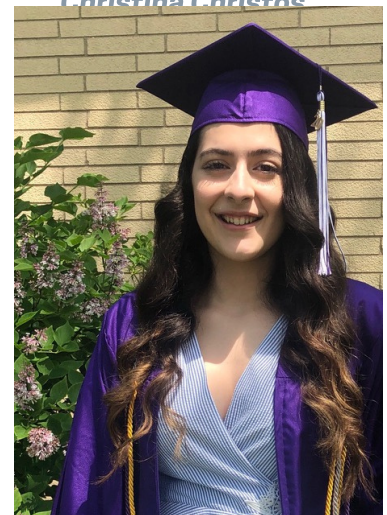

The Metropolis of Chicago Philoptochos has initiated the Mask Matters project in which we are requesting that all our chapters participate in creating face covering masks to help slow the spread of Covid-19. These masks will not be distributed to first responders or health care workers. Instead our homemade, DIY masks will be donated to nursing homes, health care facilities, parishioners, etc. Our goal is to donate 10,000 mask by the end of the year. We have already donated almost 2,000 masks!
