The Role of Architecture in Caring for Our Common Home,

Presented by Douglas Farr

Douglas Farr leads Chicago-based Farr Associates, a pioneering architecture and urban design firm which designs livable and sustainable places and buildings. Doug is a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects and the Congress for New Urbanism. He co-chaired the development of LEED-Neighborhood Development and authored two books: Sustainable Urbanism (2008) and Sustainable Nation (2018). In 2017 Planetizen named him one of “the 100 most influential urbanists of all time.” A native Detroiter, he is an architecture graduate of the University of Michigan and Columbia University. In 2020 he started Carbon Free Chicago, a thirty-year campaign for the timely and equitable transition to a fossil-free region.
