A Message from Father Rick

Greetings Brothers and Sisters:

As we prepare for Great and Holy Week (April 8-16) our *Lenten Lectures* on Wednesday evenings will end on April 5th with *Christina Kidonakis* speaking about Holy Pascha and Agape Vespers completing our theme of *Holy Week Journey*. We thank our sponsor: *The Helen Galanis Lectureship Fund*! Please look for my Pascha letter with complete schedule in the mail very soon!

The celebration of Great and Holy Pascha is the absolute pinnacle of the liturgical year for Orthodox Christians. The word 'Pascha' comes from the Hebrew word meaning 'Passover' referring to the awesome event that occurred amongst the ancient Israelites under slavery to the Egyptians in the time of Moses. It now refers to Christ's Passover from life to death on the Cross to a new resurrected life from Hades.

Orthodox Christians do not use the word 'Easter.' However, it has become commonplace in the West. Why? The Venerable Bede, a seventh-century Anglo-Saxon historian, writes that the word Easter comes from the goddess Eostre, an ancient goddess of fertility and the goddess of the dawn who originated in what is now Scandinavia. Over time, early Christians started referring to the Feast of the Resurrection by the name of the month in which it was celebrated—Eosturmonath (what we now call April). Another, related theory suggests that Easter comes from an old German word for "east," which in turn is derived from a Latin word for "dawn." In the past, the word easter could mean "to turn toward the east" and didn't necessarily have any implied religious meaning. (www.uscatholic.org)

We also completed our *Lenten Retreat* in March with theologian *John Panagiotou* speaking about Stewardship as a Way of Life. Renewal. Based on his book, "*The Path to Econon-mia*" we learned about the history and practice of Old Testament tithe as well as Jesus' new ethic of complete, wholistic self-sacrifice including monetary wealth and income. We thank our sponsor (the Creticos Family Lecture Fund), the attendees and our hosts who prepared and served the meals.



PASTORAL MESSAGE (CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1)

Our *youth programs advisory board* has recommended a candidate for the youth director position. Whether or not that person or another takes the job, we have several parents and youth advisors volunteers to ensure that all youth programs and activities continue. Robust parent involvement and support is essential to any youth program.

The *Winter/Spring Catechism Course* has two more classes: April 3 and 24th. The next course will be offered next Fall beginning in mid-September.

I, along with several other SSPP parishioners had the honor to attend the *Hellenic American Police Association* (HAPA) Dinner/Dance at Chateau Ritz on Feb.24 to celebrate their 30-year anniversary. Centered in Chicago, HAPA represents over 600 law enforcement officers at all levels of government across our country. It was a wonderful event to honor those who serve and protect along with those who support HAPA and the police.

Our 2023 campaign season is winding down: "Giving Thanks: Eucharist Stewardship." Giving is based on gratitude for what we have received. And there is no greater gift and no greater thanks than to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are still encouraging pledges for this year.

Our operational expenses in 2023 will be nearly \$1.5M and with necessary capital projects our total is over \$1.7M. With approximately 610 families we need an average stewardship of \$2,824 per individual/couple/family. Statistics show the average household income for the Northshore area is about \$160K. So, that gives a gauge for being above or below the average. Some might say the hurdle is too high or the increase is too large. Think of it this way: *if everyone gave \$3.56 more per day, we would meet this goal*. Now some can afford to give \$10, 20 or 30 more per day. Our proportional giving must be generous and sacrificial, giving to God and His Church the first and best fruits of His gifts to us!

A new *Memorial Donation Policy* was recently approved by the parish council. It accompanies a cover letter sent 2-3 months after a funeral encouraging surviving family to contemplate uses of memorial donations given in memory of their dearly departed loved-one. It suggests some possible funds and pro-

jects and allows for suggestions by the family. It sets forth an outer limit of 13 months to designate the memorials.

This month of *April activities* include Philoptochos Lenten Retreat at St. Athanasios Church (April 4), Palm Folding and Bay branch prep (April 7), Lazaros Saturday Liturgy and Sanctuary cleaning (April 8), Holy Friday worship services, sanctuary decorating and youth day (April 14), Bright Renewal Week (April 17-22), Bright Friday Liturgy at St. Iakovos Retreat Center (April 21), and Metropolis Oratorical Festival at Ascension Church and Parish Council Past Presidents dinner (April 22).

Looking ahead into May – Metropolis Clergy Retreat (May 1-4), Spring Parish Assembly & AHEPA Sunday (May 7), Philoptochos Spring Luncheon (May 13), Mother's Day (May 14), Sts. Constantine & Helen & Graduate Sunday & Habitat for Humanity Concert (May 21), Ascension Feast at our sister church (May 25); Junior Olympics (May 26-27), Memorial Day (May 29). We will host the Fall of Constantinople Commemoration event on June 1st.

We are quickly approaching our blessed Holy Week, beginning with the Palm Sunday service on April 9th and culminating with Holy Pascha service on Saturday/Sunday at the stroke of midnight, and our Agape service at 11:00 AM on Sunday morning. We should all make our commitment to attend as many of these Holy Week services as possible, as they represent the storyline of our faith; Christ's triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, His betrayal, arrest and trial, His death by crucifixion, descent into Hades and His glorious resurrection on the third day. Holy Week is our Faith as Orthodox Christians. It is our Identity. It is who we are!

The Headlines

Well, Spring is just around the corner and for those of us on the Saints Peter and Paul Parish Council, post-Pascha Springtime can only mean one thing ... CONSTRUCTION! This Spring/Summer will see the completion of two of our 2022 projects, both already funded; our HVAC project, replacing the unit that currently services the Church Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall, as well as the long-awaited (and long-discussed) Solar Panel Construction project. In addition, 2023's projects include the first of our five-year capital maintenance initiative to tuckpoint and repair our aging Latto Center. We are also accepting donations to refurbish our kitchen. Also, our Kitchen Refurbishment Committee has been meeting regularly, with the ultimate goal of defining the vision of what best suits the Parish's needs for the future.

Help Wanted

In our March Messenger, I mentioned the "Three T's": "Time, Talent and Treasure", as our way of understanding that money isn't the only way of giving to the Orthodox Church and to the betterment of our community. We all can give, based on what we have to give. CAPITAL PROJECTS UPDATE

Why 'One' Ask? Why 3 Percent?

Nearly three years ago, our parish council adopted a modified stewardship program that incorporates capital into the overall year-to-year fundraising program. We are trying to avoid little fundraisers and fees, as well as separate capital efforts, with an annual proportional giving campaign.

If every parishioner, couple and family gives three percent (3%) of their gross annual income we can cover all of our ministries and major capital needs each year.

For 2023, several projects are beginning in mid-April. The sanctuary HVAC replacement cost of \$375,000 was previously raised through increased stewardship and generous individual gifts. Also, the first phase of exterior brick tuckpointing will begin on the most distressed part of our community center. The cost is \$60,000.

Also, we are spending \$7,000 to repair water leakage in the kitchen area. A newly formed committee is carefully examining further needs in the kitchen area starting with over \$40,000 in memorial donations.

The long-awaited solar panel project is ready. The entire cost of \$225,000 was covered by a single anonymous donor. The 122k-W system is projected to save the parish \$350,000 over the 25-year life of the panels.

Several other projects were approved at the November 2022 parish assembly and are slated to begin in 2023.

Please consider a generous and sacrificial increase in your stewardship this year and beyond. If every single person gives at least \$3.56 more per day, we can reach our goals to strengthen our ministries and revitalize our facility for the next fifty years.
