Greetings Brothers and Sisters:

So much has happened in the last month including...

Our Lenten Retreat – April 5-6-7 with theologian Dr Presvytera Jeanne Constantinou speaking on the theme: Crucifixion of the King of Glory. Dr. Jeanne received rave reviews as a dynamic and impassioned speaker. Our men's group has been studying her other book, 'Thinking Orthodox: Understanding and Acquiring the Orthodox Christian Mind.' Videos of the lectures will be posted soon.

Also during Lent, we enjoyed Dr Nathan Hoppe, OCMC missionary Albania speaking at our Lenten Lectures on Fostering Vibrant Local Eucharistic (LEC). The theme and topics were well received and thought-provoking. We hope to implement the eight principles into our parish context.

Every year, we are seeking to

participation and involvement with the liturgical life of the parish. Occurring on the last Monday of May each year, our parish conducts a memorial service at the Greek section in Memorial Park Cemetery in Skokie at 10am Monday morning. Our second annual *Animal/Pet Blessing service* has been rescheduled to *Saturday June* 22^{nd} at 11:00am. Please be sure your pet is leashed, caged or otherwise under control to make sure everyone (including the pets) is safe and happy.

The *Multi-source* Feedback **Process** data has been collected and based on the feedback I have chosen my priority areas after several meetings with the consultant and steering committee, I began setting goals to help leverage my strengths and work on my growth areas. The overall results were very positive. The top strength areas are Calm/ Steady Demeanor, Worship and Sacraments, Treating Others Fairly/Equally, and Desiring Personal/ Professional Growth. My top growth areas are Managing Demands on My Time, Spoken Communication, Sermons, Relationship Building and Teamwork, Vision and Goal Setting, and Change Management. The consultant strongly advises only working on one or two areas at a time over a period of several months.

The Stewardship 2024 Archdiocesan theme is "*Well done good and faithful servant*" (Matthew 25:24). These are Jesus' words told in the Parable of the Talents (Mt.25:14-30) to the two servants who multiplied the gifts given to them by their master. Jesus calls the third servant, who buried his one talent in the ground, "*wicked and lazy*" (v.26) and he represents

those who use their gifts from God only for earthly things (St Gregory the Great).

God's guideline for giving is the tithe (10%). He gives us everything but only asks for ten percent in return. That's a pretty good deal. With a total (operations & capital) annual parish budget of \$1.7M we encourage everyone to strive towards tithing (10%) but suggest a minimum of four percent (4%) annual giving.

GREAT AND HOLY PASCHA

After Jesus' crucifixion, Mary Magdalene and other women went to anoint His body on Sunday morning. They found the tomb empty, met angels who told them of His resurrection, and shared the news with the disciples. Peter and John confirmed the empty tomb. Jesus had been crucified on Friday, rested in the grave on Saturday, and rose on Sunday, fulfilling the prophesied three days. This Resurrection, celebrated as Pascha, signifies our freedom from sin and death, ushering in eternal life. The day marks rest in honor of the Lord's victory over death, replacing the old Sabbath.





How beautiful the last few weeks have been! In the Springtime we have the wonderful opportunity to see God's blessings at work; trees are coming to life and tulips are blooming everywhere you look. Springtime also means we celebrate Great and Holy Lent, where we put a heightened focus on prayer, good-will and drawing closer to God. The Orthodox Couples Club, as part of our ministry calendar, supports a Lenten Service Project each year. This year we had the pleasure of visiting Bernie's Book Bank in Lake Bluff, where we helped to sticker books that will be packaged up and distributed to children in need. What's so special about this event for the OCC is that this is a family friendly events, couples and kids coming together on a Saturday afternoon to do some good, a true treasure! I must also say, this group worked like a machine! What a blast we had - thank you so much to those of you that came out.

If you're unfamiliar with Bernie's, I'll share a bit about their mission. Brian Floriani, a reading paraprofessional from nearby Zion, quickly realized that while reading is the single most important skill a child needs, children were clearly lacking access to age-appropriate books in their homes. Bernie's Book Bank was born in 2009 - out of a garage no less, as of course most magnificent things are! - and has expanded year after year, distributing over 25 million books since their inception. Bernie's is 100% funded by generous individuals, organizations, and foundations, and would never be able to succeed and process as many books as they do without the stellar help of volunteers. RENEWING GOD'S HOUSE

UPDATE

The Parish approved a Capital Plan in 2019 to renew the components of our Church and Latto Center buildings. Despite COVID shutdowns and supply chain issues we have completed numerous major and minor projects in the last four years through your generous annual stewardship commitments and special donations without a Capital Fundraising Appeal. We are busy planning and executing several projects again this year.

• This year's masonry restoration and tuckpointing project has been completed. The plan is to have all elevations of both buildings completed by 2028.

• A contract has been signed to replace the handrails on the four sets of stairs in the Latto Center Atrium and to install guardrails on the upper level of the Atrium in compliance with ADA requirements. That work is scheduled for the second week of July when AGAPE Christian Academy is on summer break.

• We are in the process of finalizing bids to replace damaged concrete sidewalks and stairs. The new sidewalk in front of the entry to the Latto Center will be poured to meet ADA specifications and allow easier wheelchair access.

• In the past four years we have been patching areas in the parking lot that were severely damaged. This year we are obtaining bids to restore the entire parking lot in five phases. • The Kitchen Committee has finalized the plans to update and refurbish the fellowship hall kitchen. That work will commence Bright Monday.

• The Athletic Committee has come up with a list of safety upgrades and improvements to the gymnasium, including installing additional wall pads and window tinting. A hearty thanks to PC member Peter Triantafillou and his father, as part of their stewardship of time, talent, and treasury, for completing the improvements to the gym closets.

• We are meeting to determine the scope of the Latto Center Classroom Remodeling & Furnishings project that was approved by the Parish Assembly.

In addition to mobilizing these projects, there are several small projects such as painting and landscaping repairs that we can use your talents to complete. If you have time to devote to a project, contact me john@vranas.com and we will find a place for you.

We are also starting to plan next year's projects. Contact me if you know a trusted window contractor to replace the Latto Center windows.


