

Order of the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom

COMMUNION GUIDELINES

To partake of Holy Communion one must be a baptized/chrismated Orthodox Christian and be in good standing with the church. Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting and regular aparticipation in Holy Confession are welcome to receive communion. One should also be present at the Liturgy before the Scripture readings. Please follow the directions of the ushers during Holy Communion. For the Non-Orthodox Although we cannot offer Holy Communion to non-Orthodox Christians, we do invite them to come forward during Communion for a blessing from the priest. Simply approach with hands crossed over your shoulders, state your name and bow your head. The priest will bless you and then you may return to your seat. Antithoron is the blessed bread that is distributed after Holy Communion and at the end of the Divine Liturgy. The word means 'instead of the gift' and is offered to everyone including non-Orthodox. If you are a visitor or guest, you can receive the antithoron.

SAINTS AND FEASTS SEVEN HOLY YOUTHS OF EPHESUS

The Seven Youths hid themselves in a certain cave near Ephesus in the year 250, to escape the persecution of Decius. By divine grace, a sleep came upon them and they slept for 184 years, until the reign of Saint Theodosius the Younger, when the doctrine of the resurrection was being assailed by heretics. They then awoke, that is, were resurrected, confirming in the sight of all the bodily resurrection; and again after a short time, by divine command, they reposed in the Lord in the year 434.



RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION

Eternal with the Father and the Spirit is the Word, Who was begotten of the Virgin for our salvation. As the faithful, we both praise and worship Him; for He consented to ascend the Cross in the flesh and to endure death. Thus, He raised the dead unto life through His all glorious resurrection.

APOLYTIKION OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

O Leaders of the Apostles and teachers of the world, intercede with the Master of all, that He may grant peace to the world and to our souls the great mercy.

KONTAKION OF THE TRANSFIGURATION

You were transfigured on the mountain, O Christ our God, showing Your disciples as much of Your glory as they could bear, so that when they see You crucified they will know that You suffer freely, and they will tell all the world that You are truly the radiance of the Father.

HYMN TO THE THEOTOKOS

It is truly meet to bless you, O Theotokos, ever-blessed and most pure, and the Mother of our God. More honorable than the Cherubim, and beyond compare more glorious than the Seraphim, who without stain didst give birth to God the Word. True Theotokos, we magnify you!



At that time, getting into a boat Jesus crossed over and came to his own city. And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say 'Rise and walk?' But that you may know that the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" he then said to the paralytic -- "Rise, take up your bed and go home." And he rose and went home. When the crowds saw it, they were afraid, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to men.
