

# PASTORAL MESSAGE

### **CONTINUED...**

Cleaning (Dec.21, 2-5pm), St Anastasia (relics are in our holy altar table) & Children's Christmas Pageant (Dec.22)

Nativity Services – Tues. Dec.24th Royal Hours 9-10:30am, Vesperal Divine Liturgy 5:00pm followed by the brief concert of carols by our choir; Wed. Dec.25th Orthros 8:30am and Divine Liturgy 9:30am.

In addition, we can preserve the spirit of the season through quiet contemplation. This is challenging with the holiday shopping season, holiday parties, and end of year deadlines. We should strive not to precelebrate Christmas. The Orthodox Church celebrates with the fast-free, joyful *Twelve* (12) *Days of Christmas* (*December 25th to January 6th*, for Theophany/Epiphany). We must be intentional about how and where we will spend our time and energy during Advent.

The month of December is also our biggest for stewardship revenue. You should receive a statement dated around Nov.30th that reflects your giving so far this year. For 2023, we still need to receive approximately \$300K by the end of the year to meet our stewardship goal. At this time, we ask three things: 1) if you made a stewardship pledge, be sure to fulfill it; 2) if you have not pledged, be sure to make a stewardship contribution; and 3) no matter if you pledged or did not, consider how God has blessed you and give generously even beyond your planned stewardship contributions.

The 2025 Archdiocese Stewardship Theme is "See Our Church as it Could Be." A secondary, related theme is "Your Own from Your Own, We Offer to You." The latter is the petition/ prayer from the Divine Liturgy when the priest raises the gifts of bread and wine. The point is whatever we give to God is not really ours. Rather it is gift from Him that we offer back to Him with thanksgiving. Regarding the former theme, our parish can only reach its potential if we generously and sacrificially offer back what God has already given to us. In the coming weeks, we w i 11 have increased communications around the topic of stewardship.

God's guideline for giving is the tithe (10%). He gives us everything but only asks for ten percent in return. That's a pretty good deal. With a total (operations & capital) annual parish budget of \$1.7M we encourage everyone to strive towards tithing (10%) but suggest a minimum of four percent (4%) annual giving.

# CHURCH SOLAR PANNELS

### **POWER OF THE SON!**

We are pleased to provide an updated report on the performance of our solar panel system installation that was put online September 2023. In the last 12 months the system has generated 134 MWh of electric power yielding savings of nearly \$14,000.


In the process of approving this project, Metropolitan Nathanael commended Saints Peter and Paul "...for your innovative approach to preserving our environment."

The total cost to install the system was about \$225,000 that was paid for by a generous Steward of our Parish. Every dollar of energy generated by the system can be used to support our various ministries. Truly power from the Son!

# STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

### **Introduces New Mission Themed Budget for 2025**

We are introducing a new way of understanding the financial income and expenses related to sustaining our parish community. It is called the "Mission-Themed Budget." Instead of talking about utility bills, office expenses, salaries and benefits, etc. we will focus on the mission of our parish and how everything we do relates to it.

The mission of SSPP parish is "To proclaim the Gospel through Orthodox Christian worship, fellowship, service, and witness."

Based on the mission, we have grouped and renamed some income and expense categories with corresponding numbers as percentage of total budget.

### Mission-themed Income: \$1,886,000


- Stewardship- offerings from individuals, couples and families 49%
- Church Offerings & Misc- candles, trays, etc. 10%
- Education- Agape, Church & Greek School, Bookstore 20%
- Capital Donations- designated gifts and offerings. 21%

### Mission-themed Expenses \$2,125,000

- Ministers- Clergy and Youth Director 21%
- Ministerial Support- all admin staff 14%
- Teachers/Education- Agape, Greek & Church Schools, 16%
- Orthodoxy in the World- Archdiocese, Metropolis, Outreach, Philanthropy 8%
- Fellowship-Hospitality, Youth, Athletics, etc. 7%
- God's House/Our Home- everything for land & buildings 14%
- Capital Improvements- permanent changes to God's House 21%

As you can see our *2025* budgeted expenses exceed income by \$239,000 Thus, we need to increase our giving primarily through stewardship. Please give sacrificially and generously support the mission of our parish!




