The Orthodox Church celebrates with the fast-free, joyful Twelve (12) Days of Christmas (December 25<sup>th</sup> to January 6<sup>th</sup>, for Theophany/ Epiphany). As well this month of January includes St. Basil Chicago parish feastday (Dec.31 Vespers; Liturgy at SSPP Jan.1), Theophany/ Epiphany Feast (Jan.5-6), St John the Baptist Des Plaines parish feast day (Jan.6-7), Parish Vasilopita (Sun.Jan.12), Catechism classes begin (Jan.13, on Monday evenings), St Athanasios Aurora parish feast day (Vespers Jan. 17; Liturgy at SSPP Jan. 18), Sanctity of Life service at All Saints Antiochian Chicago (Jan.26).

We ring in *the New Year* by celebrating our Father and Hierarch *St. Basil the Great* as well as the

Circumcision of our Lord on January 1st. According to secular traditions, many develop resolutions for beginning the new year. Let us resolve to become more Christ-like by deepening our involvement in the life of His Holy Church. This includes more frequent and full participation in Sunday Divine Liturgy, reception of the Holy Eucharist, Holy Confession and Holy Unction as well as the various ministries and programs of our parish.

We strict fast on January 5<sup>th</sup> in order to prepare for the Great Feast of *Theophany/Epiphany*—the Baptism of our Lord by John in the Jordan River. This Feast of Lights (Ta Phota) has great meaning and significance for our lives, one of which is the renewal of our human nature. Every year we pray that Christ blesses and sanctifies the waters of creation, and we take that Holy Water (Agiasmos) and sprinkle it and drink it at church and at home for the sanctification of our souls and bodies.



#### **SAINT BASIL THE GREAT (JANUARY 1)**

Saint Basil the Great was born in 329 in Caesarea of Cappadocia to a devout and learned family, many of whom are recognized as saints. After studying in Constantinople and Athens, he embraced an ascetical life under the influence of his sister Macrina. As bishop from 370, he defended Orthodoxy against Arianism, demonstrating unwavering courage and faith even under threats from Emperor Valens. Known for his eloquence and wisdom, Saint Basil authored significant theological works, including Hexaemeron and On the Holy Spirit. He passed away on January 1, 379, at the age of 49, and is celebrated as a "revealer of heavenly things."

If you wish to have your home blessed, please email me to schedule a date/time. Please be sure to have the following items ready: icon, candle, incense and charcoal, large serving bowl with water and a sprig of basil or evergreen. The *Blessing of Homes* service consists of petitions and prayers with the sprinkling of the holy water throughout the home. The service begins and ends in a central gathering place like the kitchen or dining room.

The *Winter/Spring Catechism Course* will be Monday evenings 7-9pm, beginning *January* 8<sup>th</sup> extending 12 weeks. These classes are open to everyone: seekers, inquirers, curious, catechumens, and already Orthodox. Please help spread the word. We have a great cohort of teachers. We look forward to a great group of students. Learning is a life-long

endeavor, especially when it comes to the Faith in Christ.

The 2025 Archdiocese Stewardship Theme is "See Our Church as it Could Be." A secondary, related theme is "Your Own from Your Own, We Offer to You." The latter is the petition/ prayer from the Divine Liturgy when the priest raises the gifts of bread and wine. The point is whatever we give to God is not really ours. Rather it is gift from Him that we offer back to Him with thanksgiving. Regarding the former theme, our parish can only reach its potential if we generously and sacrificially offer back what God has already given to us. In the coming weeks, we will have increased communications around the topic of stewardship.

God's guideline for giving is the tithe (10%). He gives us everything but only asks for ten percent in return. That's a pretty good deal. With a total (operations & capital) annual parish budget of \$1.7M we encourage everyone to strive towards tithing (10%) but suggest a minimum of four percent (4%) annual giving.

Finally, we remember our departed loved ones in the year 2024.

## BASKETBALL AND SALVATION

#### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER

Some of you may know I like to play basketball. SSPP is the first parish I have served that has a gymnasium. Unfortunately, I haven't been able to play for the last two years because of various injuries. I got my start playing hoops at church when I was in about eighth grade. We had a junior high team at St Mary Church in Minneapolis. I wasn't very good until I went to a summer basketball camp. It was a week-long overnight camp, and I did it two years in row after ninth and tenth grades. Basketball season only lasted two or three months, going to church, attending liturgy and youth activities—that was year-round.

What is now known as the (GOYAL) Greek Orthodox Youth Athletic League) Family Basketball tournament got its start back in the late 1940s and early 1950s that brought Greek Orthodox churches and teams together from Iowa and Minnesota. It was called UMHOF (Upper Midwest Hellenic Orthodox Federation). Eventually, it embraced churches and teams from all over the Western District of the Metropolis of Chicago.

Our high school team won the championship in 1980 and I started playing on the men's team in 1983. In the 1980s our Mpls team on six championships including five straight. Our team would also travel to Chicago and play in the NHIBT (National Hellenic Invitational Basketball Tournament). One year we took the third place and another year we won the consolation championship. During this time, I also coached the boys' teams for a few years.

In 1990 Pres. Jane and I were married and started seminary. I played on the team there in a rec league against teams from the local Greek Orthodox Churches. One year we won the championship and another year we placed third in the Harry Agganis Invitational tournament. After I graduated, I served Holy Apostles in Westchester IL and Kimissis tis Theotokou in Racine WI but played very little organized basketball. When I returned to the Twin Cities in 1999 and began serving St George Church in St Paul MN, I started playing again with the men's team from our church. Over the course of almost twenty years, we had a couple second place finishes and one championship. Several of those years Ned Bentley (Elea's husband) played on our team. For 15 years I was also the spiritual advisor for the GOYAL Family Basketball tournament.

Why am I telling you all this? I have played a lot of basketball, and I have seen a lot of players come and go. All of them loved the game but not all of them loved Jesus more than the game. I've seen a lot of guys only want to play but not to stay--for liturgy or other spiritual activities. I've seen a lot of people say we must have a basketball program to bring kids into the Church, but it just doesn't work that way. Kids and adults don't believe in Christ because of basketball.

I've been at SSPP parish for over five years now and I see some of the same patterns and false beliefs here as elsewhere. Many people remember when Fr. Angelo cancelled the basketball program. I'm sure his reasons were the same problems that still exist today, here and in other parishes--kids come for bball but they don't come for liturgy, church school or vouth group. Some parents were in an uproar at the time and held a special meeting to voice their concerns. Some families left the community to go to other churches. Eventually, the program was reinstated but it raised concern about the relative importance we place on basketball (and all athletics) versus our Faith. That concern still confronts us today.

There is a reason that the GOAL (Greek Orthodox Athletic League) of Chicago has rules that include the following:

"Players MUST be involved and active members in their home parish's youth programs, including but not limited to Junior G.O.Y.A. or J.O.Y. throughout the year and must regularly attend Church (the Divine Services) faithfully." (1f, 2c)

"To be eligible to play in a game, players and coaches must attend the Divine Liturgy on the day of the game or the day after a game (if the game is played on a Saturday). A Wedding or Baptism does not count. It is also highly recommended that each player attends Sunday School. Sunday School is an important part of the catechesis of the Church and all youth should participate and learn about their faith and the Church. However, Sunday School CANNOT REPLACE worship in the Divine Liturgy. It shall be the responsibility of the Coach(s) and Athletic Directors of each Parish to monitor the attendance of players to ensure their participation in the G.O.A.L. The G.O.A.L is in place to complement ministries of the Metropolis and is not meant to be a standalone basketball league." (3i)

"Best Example of Sportsmanship, attendance at the Divine Liturgy, Sunday

Church School attendance, Youth Group involvement (including retreat participation and overall behavior). This information is to be supplied by the Parish Priest or lay youth minister." (7/8<sup>th</sup> grade division, #9)

"Church Teams and/or Coaches participating in other outside tournaments or leagues from the 1st of September through the G.O.A.L. Basketball Season is strongly discouraged if they interfere with Metropolis programs, either educational, liturgical, spiritual, or athletic. As requested by His Eminence, Church teams should not participate in athletic events outside of Metropolis sponsored programs if they conflict with Metropolis programs and if they at all impede the spiritual and religious development or education of the young people involved, in being absent from their Church's Divine Services, Sunday School, Altar Service, or Choir." (ibid, #15)

"Each parish is required to have a Mandatory Parents/Coaches/Athletes Meeting before the season begins to discuss the G.O.A.L. Basketball Season in its entirety with those will be participating, especially parents, players and coaches, with the clergy of the parish present. The Parish Priest(s) must also attend. A copy of the sign-in sheet from the Parent/Coaches/Athletes meeting must be submitted to their Parish Priest prior to the first regular season." (3m)

"Our patron Apostle Paul wrote to his disciple Timothy,

"And also if anyone competes in athletics, he is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules." (2Tim.2:5). When we love Christ with all our heart, mind, soul and strength, and our neighbor as ourselves (Mt.22:37-40), we don't need rules to tell us the right thing to do. I am heartened by what I see the high school boys' coaches (Matthew Assimos and Steven Thell) doing and teaching their players--that faith and salvation are more important than basketball (or any sport or anything else). I hope that all the parents and coaches and our whole community join together in this same message and spirit, committing one another and our whole lives to Christ our God.




#### SAINT NICHOLAS PROJECT
