

Christ has Ascended!

Thank you especially to retiring teachers *Kevin & Pam Paradies* and *Anna Engro*, and to our leadership team of *Nick & Kery Obradovoich*, and *Elaine Carrozza*.

*Junior Olympics* took place *May 25-26*. No results or photos as of this writing. Congratulations also to our *Metropolis Oratorical* participants on *April 26<sup>th</sup>*.

Metropolitan Nathanael issued a follow-up encyclical to his initial one on the *Catechumenate*. The latter reaffirms the continuation of the catechumen litany and prayer. It also clarifies that the fervent litany and prayer, along with the two prayers of the faithful prior to the Great Entrance be included and read out loud. Of course, the purpose is to further emphasize and uplift the evangelical spirit of the parish communities and deepen the experience of the Divine Liturgy for all

Saturday Vespers will discontinue during the Summer

except for a few major festal periods (e.g. Pentecost on *June* 7<sup>th</sup> and SSPP Feast on *June* 28<sup>th</sup>).

We are happy to host again the *Mission Team Chicago banquet* on *Tuesday June 3<sup>rd</sup>* to benefit the *Orthodox Christian Mission Center (OCMC)* and its missionaries. *Fr. Luke Veronis* will be the keynote speaker talking about the life and witness of *Archbishop Anastasios of Albania*.

The great Feast of *Pentecost* will occur *Sunday June 8th* culminating with the *Kneeling Prayers* at the end of the Divine Liturgy. The day before, *June 7th*, we will also have Divine Liturgy for the *Saturday of the Souls*. Please submit names of departed/deceased loved ones. The week after Pentecost is Fast Free—no fasting required. Only feasting to celebrate the birth of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church!

Later that same afternoon, we will have our 4<sup>th</sup> Annual *Animal*/

Later that evening we will hold our Ministry Council meeting where we bring together the leaders of all our various ministries to discuss important issues and plan the future together.

The following Sunday June 15th is Father's Day and also the Feast of All Saints. Please celebrate your father by accompanying him to liturgy. From June 16<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> is the forgotten Fast of the Apostles. Please honor them and God by refraining from meat and dairy, reducing intake and offering almsgiving to help those in need.

On Tuesday June 17th we will host a speaking event by Fr. Vasileios Thermos who will talk about his two latest books: The Dramatic Journey of Faith (about convert journeys to Orthodoxy) and The Alliance of Compassion and Integrity (about pastoral the queer movement).

We are open throughout the summer and Divine Liturgies are scheduled for every Sunday and weekdays for major feasts and saints. Even though we do not have Church School classes, we should still come for Sunday Liturgy. If we are travelling for vacation, we should look to attend an Orthodox Christian Church nearby or on the treatment of homosexuality and way. This is an excellent way to continue to center our life around God and to experience other parishes and styles of worship.

The 2025 Archdiocese Stewardship Theme is "See Our Church as it Could Be." A secondary, related theme is "Your Own from Your Own, We Offer to You." The latter is the petition/ prayer from the Divine Liturgy when the priest raises the gifts of bread and wine. The point is whatever we give to God is not really ours. Rather it is a gift from Him that we offer back to Him with thanksgiving. Regarding the former theme, our parish can only reach its potential if we generously and sacrificially offer back what God has already given to us. In the coming weeks, we will have increased communications around the topic of stewardship.

God's guideline for giving is the tithe (10%). He gives us everything but only asks for ten percent in return. That's a pretty good deal. With a total (operations & capital) annual parish budget of \$1.7M we encourage everyone to strive towards tithing (10%) but suggest a minimum of four percent (4%) annual giving.

### MODERN HERESIES - SECULARISM

Means "Of or relating to worldly things or to things that are not regarded as religious, spiritual, or sacred; temporal: secular interests." Not pertaining to or connected with religion (opposed to sacred): secular music. The etymology/history shows 1250-1300; < Medieval Latin sēculāris, Late Latin saeculāris worldly, temporal (opposed to eternal), Latin: of an age, equivalent to Latin saecul(um)

long period of time  $+ -\bar{a}ris \underline{ar}^{1}$ ; replacing Middle English seculer < Old French < Latin, as above.

Sacred means "Devoted or dedicated to a deity or to some religious purpose; consecrated. Entitled to veneration or religious respect by association with divinity or divine things; holy. It goes back to 1275-1325; Middle English, orig. past participle of sacren to consecrate < Latin sacrāre to devote, derivative of sacer holy; see <u>-ed</u>

People of faith can act in a secular manner, compartmentalizing their life into religious and nonreligious. Thus, they claim faith in God and may act piously at times, but at other times and places they act as if they have no faith/belief in God.

We petition and pray numerous times during our Orthodox worship services... Remembering our most holy, pure, blessed, glorious Lady Theotokos and ever-Virgin Mary, and all the Saints, let us commit ourselves, and one another, and our **whole life** to Christ our God. (Petition of Orthodox worship services).

The Great Commandment given to Moses and reaffirmed by Christ says:

<sup>36</sup>"Teacher, which is the **great** commandment in the law?" <sup>37</sup>Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' <sup>38</sup>This is the first and great commandment. <sup>39</sup>And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' <sup>40</sup>On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." (Matthew 22:36-40)

We also remember that <sup>8</sup>Jesus Christ is **the same** yesterday, today, and forever. (Hebrews 13:8) We begin our morning and evening prayers, invoking God the Holy Spirit... "O Heavenly King, Comforter, the Spirit of Truth, who are everywhere present and fill all

things, Treasury of Blessings and

Giver of Life, come and abide in

us and cleanse us from every stain of sin." (Prayer to the Holy Spirit)

In the Old Testament, we also hear:

<sup>24</sup>Can anyone hide himself in secret places, So I shall not see him?" says the LORD; "Do I not fill heaven and earth?" says the LORD. (Jeremiah 23:24)

<sup>7</sup>Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? <sup>8</sup>If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are *there*. <sup>9</sup>*If I take the wings of the* morning, And dwell in the uttermost parts of the **sea**, <sup>10</sup>Even there Your hand shall lead me. And Your right hand shall hold me. (Psalm 139:7-10)

"Holy, holy, holy, Lord of Sabaoth: heaven and earth are filled with Your glory. Hosanna in the highest, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna to God in the highest!" (Hymn from Divine Liturgy; Isaiah 6:3)

From all these sources, we learn that the sacred-secular distinction is a false one. Our whole life and being is supposed to be sacred and holy. When we start separating off parts and call some sacred and others secular, we are making a grave

mistake, misunderstanding God's purpose for our lives.

Secularism is a functional atheism. Those who think that way and act that way are practically like atheists. Whereas, propositional atheism is stated belief, which is different starting point but reaches the same destination.

To help us understand how secularism came into the fore, we need to learn more about **Epistemology-** (episteme = knowledge + logoi = words) how we know what we know and the sources of knowledge. There are three main eras/epochs of knowledge: Premodern, Modern and Post Modern.

**Premodernism** (Beginnings up to 1650's)

Epistemology. The primary epistemology of the premodern period was based upon revealed knowledge from authoritative sources. In premodern times it was believed that <u>Ultimate Truth</u> could be known and the way to this knowledge is through direct revelation. This direct revelation was generally assumed to come from God or a god.

Sources of Authority. The church, being the holders and interpreters of revealed knowledge, were the primary

authority source in premodern time.

**Modernism** (1650-1950's)

Epistemology. Two new approaches to knowing became dominant in the modern period. The first was empiricism (knowing through the senses) which gradually evolved into scientific empiricism or modern science with the development of modernist methodology. The second epistemological approach of this period was reason or logic. Often, science and reason were collaboratively or in conjunction with each other.

Sources of Authority. As the shift in power moved away from the church, politics (governments, kings, etc.) and universities (scholars, professors) took over as the primary sources of authority. Oftentimes, a religious perspective was integrated into these modern authority sources, but the church no longer enjoyed the privileged power position.

**Postmodernism** (1950's to current times)

Epistemology. Postmodenism brought with it a questioning of the previous approaches to knowing. Instead of relying on one approach to knowing, they advocate for an which utilizes *multiple ways of knowing*. This can include the promodern ways

<u>epistemological pluralism</u>

the premodern ways (revelation) and modern ways (science & reason), along with many other ways of knowing such as *intuition*, *relational*, *and spiritual*.

Sources of Authority.
Postmodern approaches seek to deconstruct previous authority sources and power. Because power is distrusted, they attempt to set up a less hierarchical approach in which authority sources are more diffuse.

For a more full critique of secularism, read Fr. Alexander Schmemann's seminal work title "For the Life of the World: Sacraments and Orthodoxy." It was originally published in 1963 and reprinted many times in numerous languages. Our men's study group just completed the book this Spring.
