A Message from Father Rick

Greetings Brothers and Sisters:

On October 26th our community celebrated its **65th Anniversary** with a Gala. Over 300 people gathered at the Westin in Wheeling to share fellowship and memories including a slide show of photos and a 10 minute video. Special thanks to *Steve & Phaedra Koulogeorge* and the organizing committee for a super successful event that everyone enjoyed. Thank you to *Metropolitan Nathanael* for attending and participating and blessing us!

In early November, the **Metropolis of Chicago Clergy Laity Philotochos Assembly** was enjoyable and beneficial. It always edifying to see and catch up with priests and lay persons from around our five-state region. We always have important business to attend to including passing our two-year budget. This year we also approved funding for the St Iakovos Retreat Center and the purchase of a property in downtown Chicago for the new Metropolis Center.

I particularly enjoyed the speech by Dr Thomas Ranier who shared trends on religion and belief in America. Did you know that Generation Z (aka Gen Z) are making a big surge coming into churches? Dr. Ranier was also part of panel presentation regarding trends on Orthodox Christianity in America. Did you know Orthodoxy is the fastest growing Christian tradition in America? Clergy shortage and other challenges were discussed.

Also, this past month we remembered and thanked our **veterans** and **first responders** on *Sunday Nov. 9th*. We are well into the **Advent Fast** (Nov.15-Dec.25) in preparation for the celebration of our Lord's Nativity. I encourage all of us to abstain from meat and dairy products (fish is allowed except on Wednesdays and Fridays and after December 12th). Along with fasting, moral self-examination, repentance and confession are essential components of the season. The Sacrament of Holy Confession is available by appointment by contacting me.

Advent is the time when many clergy make **visitations** to *elderly and homebound parishioners*. Please let me know of any elderly and homebound members, or even former members, so I can make sure they are being taken care of spiritually.

Parish Council elections will take place on *December 7th*. We have 11 candidates and thus expect to fill all open seats and return the council to full strength in 2026. I would like to thank *Chris Atsaves, Sophia Castleberry and Julie Savopoulos* for their service on the parish council. They have chosen not to run for re-election, but we are very appreciative of their dedication, commitment and hard work on the parish council and in our community.



Foundation Awards (Dec.11), St. Spyridon feastday with Agape students (Dec.12), St Dionysios Liturgy (Dec.17), Sanctuary Cleaning backup date (Dec.20), & Children's Christmas Pageant (Dec.21), St Anastasia Feastday—her relics are in our holy altar table (Dec.22)

Nativity Services – Tues. Dec. 24th Royal Hours 9-11am--we encourage children to participate in the readings, Vespers Divine Liturgy 5:00pm followed by the brief concert of carols by our choir; **Wed. Dec. 25th** Orthros 8:30am and Divine Liturgy 9:30am.

In addition, we can preserve the spirit of the season through quiet contemplation. This is challenging with the holiday shopping season, holiday parties, and end of year deadlines. We should strive not to pre-celebrate Christmas. The Orthodox Church celebrates with the fast-free, joyful **Twelve (12) Days of Christmas** (December 25th to January 6th, for Theophany/Epiphany). Please be intentional about how and where we will spend our time and energy during Advent.

The month of **December is also our biggest** for **stewardship** revenue. You

should receive a statement dated around *Nov.30th* that reflects your giving so far this year. For 2025, we still need to receive close to \$300K by the end of the year to meet our stewardship goal. At this time, we ask three things: 1) if you made a stewardship pledge, be sure to fulfill it; 2) if you have not pledged, be sure to make a stewardship contribution; and 3) no matter if you pledged or did not, consider how God has blessed you and **give generously even beyond your planned stewardship contributions**. We are also pleased to introduce our 2026 Archdiocese Stewardship Theme: **“Rise Up and Build: Building Up the Body of Christ.”** The words of the prophet Nehemiah to the Jewish people when he saw the crumbling walls of Jerusalem “Rise up and build” (Neh.2:19), apply to us today. We must continually rise up and build up the Body of Christ. We the people together form the Body of Christ—to care out His ministry in our modern time. We are called to build up the walls of our parish temples, and at the same time, tear down the walls/barriers in and around our parish that prevent people from experience the love, mercy and forgiveness of Christ. We do this by building up our worship and

ministries. Receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist means little if we are not building up each other, carrying one another's burdens and fulfilling the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2).

God's guideline for giving is the tithe (10%). He gives us everything but only asks for ten percent in return. That's a pretty good deal. With a total (operations & capital) annual parish budget of \$2.2M we encourage everyone to strive towards tithing (10%) but **suggest a minimum of five percent (5%) annual giving** as we move into 2026.

PASTORAL MESSAGE

FROM FATHER PETER

A Message from Father Peter "It's A Wonderful Life":

One of my favorite Christmas movies of all time is....."It's A Wonderful Life." An angel named Clarence is sent from Heaven to help a desperately frustrated businessman, George Bailey, by showing him what life would have been like if he had never existed. For a movie made around 1945 (give and take a few years) it is considered one of the classics of that era.

I remember growing up around the Christmas Season you were able to see "It's A Wonderful Life" on almost every television channel. It was a time that I knew if I missed it on one TV channel that I would be able to watch it on another TV channel. I just loved watching this movie.
